Dorothy Jane (Dot) Brooks Turner died at Crestpark Nursing Home in Wynne, Arkansas on Friday, May 31, 2013 at the age of 84.

Dot was born, April 23, 1929, the third daughter to Claude and Jessie Brawner Brooks in Wynne. She graduated from Wynne High School in 1948 and married Robert Dallas Turner in 1949. Dot worked at Addison Shoe Company, Wynne High School Cafeteria, and Country Cottage Day Care. She spent many years on the family farm where she enjoyed farming, working in her flower beds, and taking her lab for a ride around the farm on her four wheeler. Dot was a member of McElroy Methodist Church, which she considered her second home. She prepared coffee, sausage balls and cinnamon rolls every Sunday morning before church for her church family, who affectionately called her "Aunt Dot".

In addition to her parents, Dot is preceded in death by her sisters, Gay Scott, Gladys Morris, Nancy Davidson and nephew, Phelan Davidson.

She is survived by her husband of 64 years, Robert "Bobby" Turner, one son and daughter in law, Brooks and Kathi Turner, granddaughter, Kerri Turner Stevenson and husband Mike, and grandson, Kevin Turner. She also leaves her sister, Ann Jordan of Fayetteville, her goddaughter Regina Lee Farmer, and her extended honorary family, descendants of Carl and Rachel Dildine, and Beth Bridges Dildine.

The family extends a grateful appreciation to the staff of Crestpark Nursing Home who cared for Dot with loving kindness and gentleness during her five-

month stay.
