“ I worked with Floyd for several years and have a memory I wish to share. Floyd was always a straight shooter and honest man. Floyd was dispatched in the Ford F350 stake bed truck to pick up an expensive loaner Perkin Elmer Atomic Absorption analyzer for the QC Lab. The machine was sent Emery Air Freight. The box was the size of a refrigerator and marked "This End Up" and was placed in the truck standing above the cab.. Floyd didn't have any rope or straps and headed home on US64. While meeting a big truck, the oncoming wind lifted the box and blew it over the side boards. Floyd saw it sliding down the asphalt in his rear view mirror. He backed up and was trying to figure out how to load the heavy instrument back into the truck. Several people stopped and helped him load it. When he came into my office, with a concerned look on his face, he asked me how did that machine cost. I replied \$23,000. He then told me what had happened and said he figured he would come up with some way to pay for it. The technician arrived the next day and the only thing that had happened was a circuit board had dislodged. Floyd was relieved and we had a good laugh about that. He obtained some good rope and straps to keep in the truck. He was a good man and will surely be missed by so many.
