Charles Mack Stacy, 90, died peacefully at home surrounded by family and friends on Sunday, February 22, 2015.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Martha and his son Mack Jr.

Mack was born in Wynne, Arkansas on March 7, 1924 to Charles Mack Stacy Sr and Florence Moore Stacy. At 19, he enlisted in the Army and on D-day sailed on the Queen Mary to the beaches of Normandy. He was a radio operator in the 7th Armed Division and was involved in the Battle of the Bulge. He graduated from Georgia Tech in Electric Engineering.

While attending Georgetown University in Washington D.C. he met Martha Brown and they married, September 14, 1950 in Silver Spring, Maryland. They moved to his hometown of Wynne and he worked for Arkansas Power & Light and was an Amateur Radio Operator.

In 1958 the family moved to Fort Worth and he began his career with Convair Aerospace. Aviation kept his interest and he earned a private pilot's license. After 32 years he retired from General Dynamics.

Community was important to him and he supported many charitable and educational organizations. He and his wife made deliveries for Meals on Wheels. He was an avid reader and passed that down to his children with weekly visits to the downtown library. He served in many capacities at the Ridglea Presbyterian Church and passed his faith onto his family.
